 - Pond work (hedge-laying in progress, sign, fence)
 - The pond itself is done until Winter 2024, hedge-laying is provided by the Council, we're just waiting for the final dates to be confirmed. A sign for the pond and the repair of the fence are also needed. A seat would be great to have there look into. (Lucy to email Repair team at The Ardagh/Caroline)
 - Cutting map (signs)
 - In progress with Council after meeting at the start of January- long term project, but focus on rewilding areas. Wildflower areas need signs to stop mowing for now. (Val to email Caroline about the areas, Lucy to email Repair team)
 - Orchard watering (new trees will have a watering regime in place for 2 summers/watering bags. Orchard only watered in drought periods. Support for Watering system for orchard - watering cans)

Small roles

Larger roles

These roles have about a minimum of an hour a month, but could take longer dependant on how much time you would like to volunteer or how many people are involved

- Leading general events (organising and on the day leading could also be specific events that you would like to be in charge of)
- Secretary (management of bank account/searching for funds etc)
- Environment lead (championing and organising the ecological side of the Friends Group)
- Community lead (championing and organising the social side of the Friends group)
