 - Hedge-laying was completed. Signs put up and banks roped off for the wildlife/plantlife. Repair Team don't do much wood working, so will need to check with Council. Update on bench below. (Lucy to email Council about gate)

 - Val and Dylan are working on signs for the Annual/ No cut areas. We will need to rake the annual cut areas ourselves in Summer. (Dylan and Val have now done amazing work putting the signs out! Start pulling together a work group at the **start of August** and keep an eye on council mowing dates. Leave trimmings in hedge again.)

 - Current boxes aren't sturdy enough, so we would have to make more. The Council will be happy to help with installation. (Need to check specifications with Council. Nice event for Scouts? Issue of materials, maybe they could provide.)
